THE PRESIDENT'S DEATH.

The following is received from Washington :

Papers found in the trunks of Wilks Booth leave no doubt but he was the assassin of the President. According to these documents the assassination was to have occurred on the 4th of March. Secretary Seward is just alive. His son Fred. H. Seward is dead.

Particulars of the President's assassination, as received at 9 15 this morning, per A. & G. W. Line:

While the President was sitting in his Private Box at the Theatre, the Assassin entered his box and suddenly fired a pistol at him, the ball entered the back part of his head and penetrated nearly through the skull. At 2:50 A. M., the President was still alive, but insensible and completely helpless.

THE ASSASSIN CAUGHT.

Washington, April 15th.

To Coleman E. Bishop:

The President and Secretary Seward were assassinated last night. The President died this morning. Saw it myself.

Johnson has been sworn in as President. President's funeral will take place Monday. Wilks Booth has been captured. Excitement in Washington is intense.

Booth is in close confinement--- Business in this City is suspended. Both Gold and Stock Board have adjourned over till Monday. A meeting of the citizens is called at the Collector's office at noon in regard to the death of the President. Gold sold in the street this a. m. at 1:55.

Gen. DIX:—Abraham Lincoln died at 7:22 this morning. Mr. Seward died at 9:30 A. M.

The assassin was Wilkes Booth.
